Marie Fox is the Queen Victoria Professor of Law, in the School of Law and Social Justice at the University of Liverpool. She had previously worked at the Universities of Lancaster, Queen's Belfast, Manchester, Keele and Birmingham. Her research focuses on legal governance of human and animal bodies and legal theories of embodiment. She is currently working on projects which explore the policing of the human/non-human boundary and the role of technologies in mediating this relation, on the applicability of the ethics of care to laboratory animals and on regulation of dangerous dogs. She is writing a monograph (with Michael Thomson, University of Leeds) which examines the ethics and legality of genital cutting of children. She is secretary and trustee of North West English Springer Spaniel Rescue.
